We have all become acutely aware of the turmoil and the subsequent tragedy caused by the coronavirus pandemic which has swept across the world over the past two years. In my view, one of the heartening things that has arisen from the uncertainty generated, is how people have faced matters positively in the eye of adversity.

Wherever you reside, humanity has pulled together; willing to give help, offering friendship, comfort and hope for the future. These acts of immense human kindness have been apparent in hospitals, care homes, places of worship, village halls and even been experienced when visiting supermarkets. In many ways, these heroes have played their part to ensure that the enduring spirit of life has continued during these unprecedented times.

One such champion was former British Army Officer, Captain Tom Moore. On 6th April 2020, at the grand age of 99 years, he embarked on a challenging walk of 100 laps of his garden to raise funds for the health service which was grappling with the influx of many thousands of COVID patients. His initial aim was to raise £1,000 pounds sterling before the eve of his 100th Birthday on 30th April. His heartfelt gesture courted the attention of the international media. Within hours of a press release, individuals and institutions from all corners of the globe generously sent in donations to boost the Captain's aspirations. By the time he had reached his 100th Birthday, he had raised the staggering amount of £30 million pounds for the health service.

In recognition of his endeavours, on 17th July 2020, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, bestowed him with a knighthood at a ceremony conducted at Windsor Castle in England. Tragically, Sir Captain Tom Moore passed away from being infected with COVID, during the February of the following year. May this incredible gentleman rest in eternal peace.

His sterling work will continue with the formation of the Captain Tom Foundation which will continue to raise monies for charitable causes. Harkness Roses (UK) have produced an exquisite red rose in his honour, which will assist in raising further funds. 'The Captain Tom Rose' will grace my garden here at Bennetts Court for many summers to come. It will not only act as a timely reminder of this fine gentleman but also the other kind people; numerous unsung heroes everywhere, whom we must salute for their unstinting and selfless efforts in making our world a brighter and safer place to live.

AUSTRALIA TO REOPEN ITS INTERNATIONAL BORDERS and welcome double-vaccinated tourists to enter from 21st February 2022.

This is great news for our delegates to the WFRS World Rose Convention. After almost two years, Australia will now reopen its international borders and welcome tourists who have had two doses of COVID vaccine. While the international borders have been opened since late 2021, entry was only for citizens and residents, with it later expanded to international students, backpackers and migrant workers. This is a welcome boost to the tourism sector. This decision is due to a significant decline in COVID cases in Australia.

"I know the tourism industry will be looking forward to that, and over the next two weeks they'll be gearing up to welcome international visitors back to Australia," the Prime Minister, Scott Morrison said. He remarked, "The fact is, the variant is here in Australia, and for those who are coming in, who are double vaccinated, they don't present any greater risk than those who are already here in Australia, so it is a sensible and very important move for us to make." If you are a fully vaccinated traveller, exempt from travel restrictions, this is a helpful checklist provided by the Australian Government when you travel to Australia: Website: https://covid.homeaffairs.gov.au/before-itravel#toc-3

These detailed instructions include requirements such as obtaining your foreign vaccination certificate, a requirement for you to complete a Travel Declaration at least 72 hours before your flight, have a pre-departure COVID test showing a negative result before your flight and hold an eligible Visa to enter Australia.

Australian rosarians have been working hard to make this convention a great success and are eagerly waiting to welcome Rose Society delegates from all WFRS Member Countries worldwide.



While most accommodation and airline providers have been flexible in this current climate, we recommend that delegates understand their airline cancellation policies before committing to flight bookings.



LECTURE SERIES Meet our Australian and International Speakers (Part 4)

MATTHIAS MEILLAND – SHRUB ROSES IN TODAY'S GARDENS: The use of Shrub Roses old and new in Public Spaces



Matthias Meilland belongs to the 6th generation of one of the most famous rose families in the world, the House of Meilland in France. Meilland International creates innovative rose varieties for the cut flower industry, for garden planting and landscaping. With agents in over 62 countries, Meilland International is a leader in the rose world.

Born in 1977, Matthias Meilland started to learn about rose breeding at age 4, guided by his grandmother, Louisette Meilland, in the breeding field of Antibes, in the south of France. At age 7, he was nominated to have a rose named after him and *Meifolio* became his first selection. As a teenager, he followed his father, Alain Meilland, in Central and South America while he was developing the cut flower industry. After studying in California and developing his video production company, Matthias joined the family business to manage Public Relations for the House of Meilland in 2013. Today, he manages the marketing department and is often in Asia and the Oceania region to develop existing and new markets.

Enjoy Matthias' presentation as he leads a tour around the globe showing the use of landscape roses in public spaces in different countries. Starting from the 1970s when the first landscape roses revolutionized the industry to nowadays introducing the latest new trends in landscaping, incorporating our favourite flowers in urban areas and highlighting the advantages. www.meilland.com

JACQUES MOUCHOTTE – LINEA ROSA®: A database of Rose Lineage



Renowned Rose Breeder and author, Jacques Mouchotte was born in France and had a long and distinguished career working for the House of Meilland from 1978 to 2013. From 1993 until his retirement, he was the Director of Research for all breeding programs and introduced several hundred new rose varieties with many winning multiple awards. He attributes his rose breeding success to his mentor Mme. Marie-Louise "Louisette" Meilland (1920-1987).

Some of Jacques well-known varieties are 'Bonica', 'Debut', 'Carefree Wonder' and 'Pierre de Ronsard' as well as the *Romantica* Series, modern roses with an old-fashioned look, such as 'Yves Piaget'. In the 1980s and 90s he developed Meillandina® miniature roses and Meidiland® landscape roses and from 2006 experimented with the concept of Drift® roses, ideal for small gardens. His many achievements include 2 Hall of Fame roses, 11 All America Rose Selections, 26 ADR champions and 91 Gold Medal winners in rose trials worldwide.

LINEA ROSA® is a comprehensive database of rose lineage created between 2013 to 2021, involving a massive 2,500 working hours compiling 20,668 entries. This fascinating presentation reveals the sources, research and dedicated work to create this important database which is maintained by the American Rose Society. It is a great research tool which provides rose descriptions with instant genealogy, genetical background and search options. A project of this magnitude is rare indeed.

ALLAN CAMPBELL OAM - SIR HANS and NORA HEYSEN: The history of Roses in their garden at 'The Cedars' and in their paintings



Allan Campbell is the Curator at The Cedars, Hans Heysen's magnificent estate in Hahndorf, Australia, which is now under the custodianship of the Hans Heysen Foundation. Allan completed extensive studies in teaching (at Wollongong Teachers College, University of Wollongong, and University of New South Wales), horticulture and landscape design (at Ryde School of Horticulture), and art (at the National Art School). He moved to Adelaide in 1980 and established a specialist retail plant nursery and landscape design consultancy in the Adelaide Hills. Since 1994 he has married his passions in education, gardens and art overseeing and promoting the Hans and Nora Heysen Foundations' Collections. Allan has been awarded an OAM and Centenary medals for services to Conservation, Environment and Art.

Hans Heysen (1877 – 1968) remains one of Australia's most popular and best loved artists. Although he is remembered more for his iconic landscapes of the Adelaide Hills and Flinders Ranges of South Australia, he was also a master flower painter. His superb oil paintings of roses picked from his own garden provide a wonderful record of the history of this unique artist's garden. The garden continued to evolve through two further generations of Heysen family ownership. Over 300 roses

continue to grow and flourish at The Cedars from the earliest plantings of Bourbons, early Teas and Musks in the 1920s and '30s through to a wide variety of Hybrid Teas and Floribundas as favoured rose varieties of subsequent family members. Hans' daughter Nora Heysen (1911-2003) established her own reputation as one of the nation's finest exponents of the art of still life painting.

ROSE KENTISH - ROSES IN BEVERAGES



An award-winning South Australian winemaker and farmer, Rose Kentish describes herself as a flavourist; she has been making wines since 1998, spirits since 2010 and dabbles in perfumery after completing Level 2 studies in Grasse, France. Her wines have received enthusiastic praise from Australia's top critics, such as 'these are cult wines' (Decanter) and 'Cult wine in the waiting' (Max Allen) and have won numerous awards, including when Rose was named inaugural AWIW Australian Winemaker of the Year 2015.

In 2016, Rose cofounded *Sparkke*, a for-purpose brewing company. Then, in 2020 she brought to life a series of spirits, made from aging brewed products and local botanicals, including roses.

In mid-2020, Rose and her husband purchased a farm on Kangaroo Island and are working to bring the bushfire ravaged land back to productivity. There, they hope to plant botanicals for use in future distilling and perfume.

Rose's passion for scent and flavour has been the drive behind her interest in using roses in beverages. Their fragrance, and the flavour from delicate essential oils that she has managed to extract from their petals, has enhanced a range of

beverages now sold commercially.

This thought provoking lecture will explore the distilling method to extract pure essential oils from roses, a subject which has fascinated Rose Kentish for many years. She used her perfumery studies to really accelerate and concentrate her interest and practical extraction of rose oils on both a 5L trial still and 200L production still. Through many trials, she tested different varieties of roses and the ultimate perfume and flavour extraction. Colour of the rose, variety, rose lifecycle and placement of the rose in the still have all affected the results.

Rose has made gin, vodka and vermouth using rose petal oils. The results are fascinating, but only the start of many more trials. And while the trials continue, the commercially available beverages are proof of the delicate, subtle and delicious qualities of roses in beverages. 


Veale Gardens, South Terrace, Adelaide

VEALE GARDENS is one of the city parks well worth a visit. There are many walks through the park around the beautiful rose gardens and water features. Last spring the roses were looking magnificent after some recent replanting and refurbishment to bring the garden back to the highest standard.



International Rose Garden - Adelaide Botanic Garden, North Terrace, Adelaide

The **INTERNATIONAL ROSE GARDEN** was opened in 2000 and is set on 1.5 hectares in the Adelaide Botanic Garden. The garden displays 2,500 roses featuring over 300 different varieties with mixed companion plants adding seasonal colour. The rose beds include Australian bred roses and many pathways that highlight roses trained on pillars and arches. There is also an important collection of Rosa species and old garden roses within the MOUNT LOFTY BOTANIC GARDEN where roses are grown in a cooler environment than in the city. Both gardens attract interest from national and international visitors. This photo also shows the Bicentennial Conservatory built in 1988, to display lowland rainforest plants together with an impressive canopy of trees.

Historic Urrbrae House and Rose Garden

URRBRAE HOUSE

One hundred years ago pastoralist and businessman Peter Waite made a bequest to The University of Adelaide; his mansion and 54 hectares of prime land. His gift specified that half was to be a park for the public and the other half to be used for the study of agriculture. His legacy is the Waite Arboretum established in 1928 and the Waite Institute which has achieved an international reputation for agricultural teaching and research. Waite was truly a man of great vision.

In 1991, the centenary of Urrbrae House, an ambitious project commenced to redevelop the gardens. The result was a blend of history, art and landscape design incorporating a Twentieth Century Rose Garden with 200 varieties. Two roses survive from Peter Waite's time, a 'Mlle Cecile Brunner' hedge and 'Madame Alfred Carrière'.

CAMAWALD in COONAWARRA is a privately owned and highly acclaimed, large country garden on 4 hectares in the South East region of South Australia, owned by Sue and John Zwar. Established in 1976, Camawald is in the heart of the world-famous Coonawarra wine region, surrounded by farming country and vineyards. It is about 370 kms from Adelaide.

The property has rural panoramic views, lawns and rose gardens with shady trees to create a tranquil setting. In summer, the ramblers flourish. Some only flower late and so in December are putting on a superb show. With the wide variety of roses at Camawald there are always plenty of blooms throughout spring and summer.

THE HERITAGE GARDEN, SEVENHILL, CLARE VALLEY was established by Walter and Kay Duncan. The property is approximately 136 kms from Adelaide. Since 2002, Walter and Kay developed a beautiful garden on two acres, featuring 2,000 roses and of particular significance 500 of them are heritage roses. Additional plants, such as delphiniums and foxgloves, create an overall scene of abundance and colour.

Australians enjoy growing roses. There are currently around 2,700 members of the National Rose Society of Australia who are passionate about the rose and rose growing. We look forward to showing you our beautiful rose gardens in the springtime in 2022.

Two years of pandemic are almost over. It was a very difficult time for rosarians. Due to all social restrictions rose societies were considerably limited in their activities.

In spite of limitations, the Slovenian Rose Society has remained active. We held outdoor gatherings in small groups, video conferences, zoom meetings and lectures.

My term as Vice President of the WFRS is slowly coming to its end. It is the time for me to review my vice presidency in the regions of Central and Eastern Europe. I've searched for contacts, travelled to many countries of the region, had many meetings and lectures, and I've tried to push activities in national societies and in WFRS further. We've achieved something, but not enough to make me really happy. I wish and hope that the new Vice-President in the Central and Eastern European region will be successful in sharing enthusiasm among rose-lovers and professionals to make the world a more wonderful place with roses.

Slovenia and the Slovenian Rose Society have contributed a large share of this enthusiasm, especially in 2017 by organizing the 1st WFRS Regional Rose Convention in Eastern Europe, thus trying to connect all the countries of roses in the region, in Europe and in the world. The convention was a successful one, well attended by rosarians from 40 countries of the world. We really succeeded to bring together and connect rosarians for Eastern Europe and give them the opportunity to present their work and rose heritage to the world.

After the convention, some rose associations were formed or reorganized and started to work again. Namely, the Rose Association in Poland, Polskie Towarzystwo Rozane (PTR) with Lukazs Rojewski on board in 2018, and the Romanian Rose Society - Romania Asociatia Amicii Rozelor din Romania. I was very happy with this success, and I hope these were encouraging events for the whole rose world.

The year 2019 was the last year with the normal programmes of the Slovenian Rose Society, including monthly gatherings, meetings in public and private rose gardens, and excursions to Italy, Austria and Poland.

Despite COVID measures in the years 2020 and 2021, we carried out some rose gatherings in Slovenia. The most important rose place in the country is Arboretum Volčji Potok, where workshops and The Slovenian Day of Roses were carried out in accordance with the rules of the Sanitary Authority of Slovenia.

We organized some gatherings in private gardens and small ones in some parks in the country. We gathered in an interesting new rose garden in the village of Kobdilj, named Villa Fabiani, in the rose garden of the Botanical Garden in Maribor, and in the rose garden Villa Mirasasso in the town of Sežana, where from year to year more well selected roses are planted.

I hope that the worst COVID restrictions are behind us. I can't wait for the new blooming season to start. The Rose Trials in Barcelona, Madrid, and in Rome are so inspiring and I'm even more excited to be included in Bologna University's trials, which we will be able to visit in the garden for the first time!

Internationally, in last two years, the officers of Slovenian Rose Societies tried to participate at the Roses Trials, where public programs were carried out. Thus, in 2020 and 2021 we participated in the most important selection in Baden Baden, Germany and then in Savernne, France, and in Nyon, Switzerland. The Nyon Rose Trial was the first since 2015 when the previous one ceased.

For the Slovenian Rose Society, it is increasingly important for cooperation with neighbouring Italy, more specifically with the Comapagnia delle rose Pordenone, an associate member of WFRS. It is a very active rose society that runs an interesting program of horticultural activities and spreads enthusiasm for roses and garden culture throughout the Italian region of Friuli. The members of the Comapagnia delle rose paid a visit to Slovenia and several members of the Slovenian Rose Society were invited to give lectures on the topic of roses in Slovenia in Pordenone.

In the Region, we can be very proud of the new Rose Trial in Warsaw, Poland, which has already started in 2020. We hope for the further development of this competitive trial and further expansion of the rose business in Poland and in the region.

Another major success for Eastern Europe is also the increasingly successful new roses from the breeder Łukasz Rojewski from Poland.

I hope for the further development of this competitive selection and the further expansion of rose activities in Poland, as this will mean a new swing in the spread of roses and gardening activities for the Eastern European region as well.

TRIENNEL REPORT FROM FRANCE

Editors Note: With the world engulfed with the COVID pandemic, there is little to report for the triennial reports often given to attendees at the World Rose Conventions. With additional costs and little to report, the organizers of the World Rose Convention in Adelaide decided not to put the report together. Our Executive Director suggested that countries who have written a report should sent it to the World Rose News for publication.

French Rose Society Triennial Report to the WFRS

Since the last WFRS World Rose Convention held in Copenhagen 2018, Denmark, to the forthcoming one to be held in Adelaide, Australia in October 2022, the activities of the French Rose Society have been heavily impacted by the COVID pandemic.

This was of course the case for most national and international associations.

This pandemic and the given restrictions have allowed us to ask questions about our existences; our lifestyles, our relationships with others, and of course, human activity which places enormous pressure on nature and the environment.

In 2019:

The French Rose Society (SFR), under the direction of a member with a passion for computers namely, Rémi Laprun, has kindly undertaken the great task to digitize the Lyon International New Roses Competition.

Previously, the scoring sheets were manual and the analysis of the notes from each juror was a tedious, delicate and meticulous operation, and above all, it was very time-consuming.

Today, the notes are taken on tablets (iPad), and the scoring tables are automatically and immediately transferred by Wi-Fi to a central file which identifies for each cultivar: the group of roses and the general standards adapted to each criteria judged, which will give a possible final score out of 100 for the cultivar concerned.

On 7 June 2019, the international rose trial took place in Lyon with French and international experts. Three special juries were set up to open up this friendly competition to the widest possible audience: the Lyon Public Jury, the Lycée Horticole Jury, and the Lyon Colleges and Primary Schools Jury.

The results were announced in the town hall of the 8th Arrondissement. This was an opportunity to meet Mr Nicolas Magalon, the new Director of the Green Spaces Department, who is taking over from Daniel Boulens, who has recently retired.

In 2019, the French Rose Society also invested a lot of time in the creation of an "educational kit"; a communication tool for the general public and a training tool for high schools and continuing education centres.

Members of the SFR were present in five European rose trials: Barcelona, Baden-Baden, Saverne, Le Roeulx (Belgium) and Orléans.

Finally, the SFR is continuing its important work to create a digital tool to visit the rose gardens of Lyon and Caluire with the use of one's own smartphone.

In 2020:

The year of the pandemic, which subsequently changed the life of the SFR!

Of course, the General Assembly of the SFR, scheduled for March 2020, had to be cancelled and postponed to November and conducted behind closed doors, which included postal votes.

Most of the international competitions of New Roses in which we usually participate have been cancelled (or deeply modified in their planned course).

The results of the Lyon Rose competition were based solely on the ratings of the Permanent Jury, whose 18 members were able to work in a normal manner despite the constraints, and thus made it possible to rate and classify the hundred or so future rose cultivars entrusted by the breeding houses to the Direction des Espaces Verts for their cultivation.

The French Rose Society continued its work of describing and identifying the taxa of the 200 varieties of botanical roses in the Caluire rose garden.

The magazine published by our association, *Les Amis des Roses*, has been enriched with the creation of two editions. One edition was in springtime, and the other in autumn.

In 2021:

The year 2021 was also a difficult year for the life of societies such as the French Rose Society. The anticipated programmes have been thoroughly revised "downwards" due to health constraints.

Despite the arrival of vaccines, we had to observe government barrier measures that penalised or neutralised several of our meetings: General Assembly, international competition, promotional events for the rose. We were able to reschedule two Board of Directors meetings and held a virtual General Assembly.

Our international rose competition in Lyon took place with special, original and simplified treatment (we could not receive our national and international juries). But this simplified formula was a huge success thanks to the support of the Municipality of Lyon.

Our participation in external competitions was limited to the Roses of Roeulx rose trial (Belgium) and that of Orléans (France).

The botanical rose garden of Caluire et Cuire is a major subject for our Society. Important work is continuing to enrich a database of nearly 250 descriptive sheets (species, old horticultural forms and cultivars) which will soon be available for consultation by means of QR codes. A presentation file to the CCVS to obtain a "conservatory" label is also underway.

Our magazine, Les Amis des Roses, had two issues published in 2021.

The Educational Kit has been produced! The SFR has contracted two specialist companies to promote this tool.

In 2022:

As we start the new year, we hope that the health crisis is behind us. By March, the health measures are easing and hope that life can return to some form of normality.

If there are new concerns about Eastern Europe, we must remain clear-headed and confident.

In 2022, we hope to return to the usual form of our International Rose Trial in Lyon. All the roses have been planted by the City of Lyon's Green Spaces Department and are doing well.

We also hope to resume our participation in French and European competitions.

We will continue our work on the Botanical Rose Garden of Caluire et Cuire and the Educational Kit, as well as our work to disseminate and popularise the rose through our magazine *Les Amis des Roses*.


